Examples of Specific Opportunities - 1

- African Doctoral Dissertation Research Fellowship (ADDRF)
 - about 20 fellowships in 2014 to doctoral students who are within two years of completing their thesis especially in health at an African university. Funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

DAAD

- Scholarships and Grants for International Students and Scholars (Academic Exchange Programme)
- Africa Initiative Graduate Research Grant
 - short-term academic placements for students enrolled in a Master's or PhD program at African universities. The program offers grants of up to CAD\$10,000 each to fifteen students per year to conduct research for up to three months at Canadian universities.

Examples of Specific Opportunities - 2

AAU Small Grants for Dissertations and Theses Programme

 facilitate the early completion of research Dissertations and Theses by graduate students in African universities; to improve the quality of research conducted by graduate students in African universities.

IDRC

 Covers the costs for doctoral field research, full study master's and PhDs, postdoctoral research, internships and visiting fellowships, training workshops, support for mentorship, funding to support the timely review and examination of dissertations.

CODESRIA 2013 Small Grants Programme for Thesis Writing

 open to graduate students and professionals currently registered in African universities, and preparing their thesis and dissertation in all social science fields and other disciplines involving social or economic analysis. Preference is given to those registered for doctoral studies (PhD or equivalent), though few grants are available for Masters thesis.

NIH

- Fogarty International Clinical Research Scholars and Fellows Program (one-year mentored clinical research training experience for doctoral students in the health sciences, including medical, dental and public health students
- National Institutes of Health Training Programs in the Biomedical Sciences
- Royal Society of Chemistry (RSC)
 - Travel Grants for PhD Students and Post-doctoral Researchers
 - Researcher Mobility
 - Research Fund
 - Public Activities
- Consortium for Advanced Research Training in Africa (CARTA) for PhDs
 - Epidemiology, Psychology, Biostatistics, Anthropology, Health Economics, Health Promotion; Demography, Sociology, Health Systems, Health Policy, Development Studies, and their interfaces with the biomedical sciences
 - Scholarship can be taken at: African universities



Some Searching Tips

- Decide on what you want
 - Sources
 - Exact keywords
- Skim through pages not to waste time on irrelevant materials
- Refer to your parameters
- Consider time
 - Be disciplined
 - You can't search everything
- Critical examination of information gathered
