STATE OF THE GRADUATE STUDENTS ASSOCIATION OF GHANA, KNUST. (STATE OF GRASAG-KNUST) BY: MR. FELIX OSAFO, PRESIDENT ON THE 3RD NOVEMBER, 2015

Right honorable speaker, the judicial committee, electoral commission, executive committee of the Graduate students, honorable members of this August house, leadership of the house, invited guests, ladies and gentlemen, GOOD AFTERNOON.

I am always filled with joy when I appear before this house not because of my position as the president of all postgraduate students but as a former member of the house. The passion and loyalty that crowded our sense of judgment and arguments in the house was superb and on point. Senators put in their best to ensure the forward movement of the association. I expect the current house to engage in gone similar constructive argument and strive to make GRASAG better.

Mr. Speaker, the association has gone through several changes from the beginning of this semester; administrative, academic transformation. We have also seen changes at the various departments of the association that we all feel proud to be part of.

OFFICE / SECRETARIAT RENOVATION

Mr. Speaker, upon assumption of office, we noticed that the office that house all the executives was not in proper and good condition. We renovated the office with new seats for visitors to feel comfortable and also purchased office chairs for the executives. Office materials were also procured to enhance proper administrative work. Several fittings have been done within the secretariat. We have fixed the electrical faults, fixed faulty air-conditions, well-labelled offices within the secretariat and others.

REGISTRATION

Registration started from September 7th -13th. The association registered local and International students, IDL and regular students. On the whole about 5000 students were registered and over 20000 exercise books, about 5000 stickers and 3500 copies of the constitution were distributed. Over 4000 bursary forms were also filled. (This figure is the sum total of all distributions across the various campuses). As part of the registration, legible students filled the bursary forms. The registration did not end here but was extended to our members in Accra. We were in Accra on the 10th and 11th of October, 2015 at the Kwabenya and Ashaley Botwe campus. Students were given 4 exercise books each, a sticker, and constitutions for first years. Though we could not reach as many students as we expected because most of them were at lectures during the periods we were around for the two days, the students were still grateful that we came. The filling of bursary forms was closed to students two weeks ago. However, registration is still ongoing where students can receive their souvenirs.

SENATE ELECTIONS AND NATIONAL CONGRESS AT UMAT

Mr. Speaker, the electoral commission of our noble association conducted elections for applicants who wanted to represent their respective departments on this year's senate. The EC opened nomination on the 25^{th} Oct, 2015 and closed it on 2^{nd} Nov, 2015. All the departmental applicants met the electoral requirements of the electoral commission and got elected accordingly. As reported by the EC in the first senate meeting, elected senators were presented for swearing in and

I say with joy that GRASAG Senate is formed and now performing its functions as the constitution demands. The remaining departmental representative elections will be conducted by the EC and elected members will be presented to senate for swearing in.

The association was also represented at the national GRASAG congress where policies of our national association were discussed and elections held to get new batch of national leadership. I must say that KNUST really distinguished itself in all matters and activities on the campus of University of Mines, Tarkwa. I am happy to report that, GRASAG-KNUST presented two candidates for the positions of vice president and treasurer. At the end of the electoral struggle, we were successful in securing these two portfolios on the national front. Messrs. Richard Nana Kofi Anoff and Ebenezer Henaku Jnr were voted as treasurer and vice president respectively.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING

The first general assembly meeting for the 2015/2016 academic year was held on the 25th September, 2015 at the college of science auditorium. The meeting started at 10:15am and closed at 2:30pm. The agenda of the meeting includes

1. ACTIVITIES FOR THE SEMESTER

A decision was reached by the house that tickets for the socializing be made available to students ahead of time.

2. Issues on Bench fee/Research support fee

A discussion on the reduction of bench fee, now research support fee is ongoing. A committee has been set up by the Graduate school, which I am a member, to consider and recommend appropriate fee relevant to one's programme of study. As a result of the committee's work, there had been a reduction in the amount charged for most departments. Though a final decision has not yet been reach, effort would be made to see how best monies would be reimbursed to students if it becomes appropriate. Concerns raised by members during the general assembly meeting centered on failure to use the bench fee for its intended purpose and this was evident based on the poor facilities at the various departments which do not meet the standard of the Postgraduate student. Other comments were commendations to the executives for the work done.

3. 2015/2016 Bursary applications issues

An explanation on the required information on the bursary form stating failure to provide all relevant information could lead to the rejection of the form.

4. 2015/2016 Senate elections

During the meeting the EC briefed members on senate elections and its formation. The Electoral Commissioner therefore opened nominations for interested members to apply, stating the modalities involved.

2.3 Deduction of an Amount of the Bursary to Assist Research

The house approved of a decision made by national officers of GRASAG to deduct GH C10 from the amount every bursary beneficiary receives

PUBLICATION AND INFORMATION COMMITTEE.

The committee started its work at the time when apathy of GRASAG members towards the association's activities was high. The major concern of the committee is to devise a means of rigorously and vigorously publicising the programmes and activities of the association.

Fortunately, the steps and measures adopted are yielding positive results. The timely dissemination of information to members has so far been marvellous. This is evident by the high turned up recorded during GRASAG programmes and activities this semester.

To continuously and accurately inform members of the happenings of the association, several strategies have been adopted to ensure timely delivery of information. The GRASAG website which has remained dormant for the past years has been revived. A team of IT Experts led by the PRO whose jurisdiction the management of the site falls was contracted to bring back the site to life. The IT Experts from the UITS were charged with the responsibility of ensuring an active and up to date website that reflects the happenings of the association. To this, a complete redesign and rebranding of the website was carried out.

The new GRASAG website, following the successful redesign and rebranding was launched on 26th October, 2015. As we speak, about 70% of the all information needed on the site has been provided. This however, came with a cost. Processes are currently underway to ensure that payment is made on time to the UITS staff. Again, in order to ensure that, the website never return to the state it was, we are currently in talks with UITS to secure the services of WEB MANAGER. This we believe will ensure continuity and constant update and upgrading of the website to meet international standard.

Members are therefore encouraged to visit **grasag.knust.edu.gh** for announcements, events, news and any other information they may need. To remain interactive and current, members are encouraged to visit our Facebook page: GRASAG KNUST, twitter: GRASAG_KNUST, and Instagram: GRASAGKNUST. The 2015/2016 executives determine to abolish the annual creation of yahoo and gmails for the running of the association made a case to UITS for official email. Our request was therefore granted through the help of the Director of UITS. All suggestions, enquiries can be sent via **grasag@knust.edu.gh** The most authoritative radio show on focus FM, GRASAG hour faced some technical challenges at the beginning of the academic year. However, all technical hiccups have been surmounted. The first show of the semester was aired on 29th October, 2015. Members are therefore entreated to listen to FOCUS FM 94.3 on every Thursday 8pm-10pm. The host of the programme is the GRASAG PRO.

The annual production of the GRASAG newsletter is also on course. Members will therefore be informed on when to submit articles for publication.

GRASAG INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS' REPORT 2015/2016

GRASAG International Students in collaboration with GRASAG KNUST started the academic year with registration of continuing and new students. During this process, which lasted for one week, there was also the registration for the NHIS. Contacts of students were taken in which some were added in the international students' WhatsApp group page. Some countries organised programmes such as socialisation, freshers' welcome party and football competition.

GRASAG International Students coordinator in the person of Ntali Emmanuel G. is in the process of forming a committee where members from the different countries would be represented for easy dissemination of information, in making GRASAG KNUST better. The committee will be presented to senate approval and ratification upon completion. As it stands now a temporal committee have been working in collaboration with the executives since the start of this academic year.

GRASAG International students have shown appreciation to the leadership of GRASAG KNUST for the opportunity and the recognition given them to fully participate in all the association's activities. The International students' committee serves as a platform where members could share ideas on international students' issues to improve their stay in Ghana as well as orientate and assist them in times of need.

BURSARY UPDATE

Mr. Speaker, the frustrations that shrouded the bursary delayance was doused when upon incessant pressure on the government by previous and current executives, the bursary was finally released to the universities. In the letter from the scholarship secretariat to my outfit, it stated that 310 students were disqualified on the following accounts;

- That some students were found to be non-regular students
- > That some students have exceeded their normal duration of study
- That some students failed to provide Index numbers
- > That some students did not complete their forms well.

Mr. Speaker, I want to put on record that the figure aforementioned is far below the reality on the ground. I can say that about 500 students were disqualified out of the 4935 applicants. The problems that surrounded

the collection of the bursary money by students at their various colleges were also resolved, especially with the IDL applicants.

SCHOOL FEES REDUCTION/BENCH FEES

Mr. Speaker, as a proactive executive body led by my humble self, we noticed the drastic increase in this year's fees for all students. We followed it up at the finance office and the vice chancellor's office to 'fight' for reduction of the 17% fees increment. We succeeded in getting the 17% reduction in the fees schedule of the business school fees but was unsuccessful with the science and arts students.

On the bench fees, this has now been nomenclature as the Research support fees. Mr. Speaker, I must say that lots of discussions have gone into bench fees issues. Most departments were invited to the dean of graduate studies board to justify what they use the bench fees for and how students can have access to their deserved percentage of the bench fee. The board meeting has not come to an end with all the departments so there is no final conclusion on the way forward of the bench fees. I can only report that some departments have started to implement the reduced scheduled as agreed at the board meeting. I hope senate will do a good job to ascertain how far the bench fee issues are going and how to help drum home the demands of students we serve.

RESEARCH COMMITTEE

The Association under the auspices of the School of Graduate Studies (KNUST) in collaboration with KNUST Library (E-Resources Section) organized Research Training programme for all postgraduate students.
